## Public Forum of the Third UN World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction

# Building Disaster Resilience through Alliances and Mutual Cooperation of Multi-stakeholders in Tohoku and Beyond: Region-wide Initiatives by the Tohoku Alliance

On Tuesday, March 17, 2015, the Tohoku Alliance, an agency operating out of the Tohoku Branch of Development Bank of Japan Inc. (Toru Hashimoto, President & CEO), will hold a Public Forum at the Third United Nations World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction. The theme will be "Building Disaster Resilience through Alliances and

Mutual Cooperation of Multi stakeholders in Tohoku and Beyond: Region-wide Initiatives by the Tohoku Alliance."

The World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction is an ongoing program held by the United Nations for the purpose of developing global disaster strategies. The first conference took place in 1994 in Yokohama. The second, held in Kobe in 2005, produced the structure for global disaster initiatives known as the Hyogo Framework for Action (HFA). The City of Sendai will host the third conference, the aim of which will be to produce a new, worldwide framework for disaster initiatives for 2015 and beyond. The selection of Sendai, which suffered extensively from the Great East Japan Earthquake of 2011, as the site of the conference gives us a great opportunity to share with the international community the lessons which Japan has learned from its experience – and to showcase the progress of the affected areas in moving toward recovery.

Along with other associations and companies working within and outside of the quake-stricken areas, DBJ is keen to share the knowledge we have gained from the 2011 disaster and the initiatives that have been taken toward reconstruction. The upcoming forum, which will be held as a symposium, will provide an excellent opportunity to discuss the importance of developing systems for regional alliance and collaboration among diverse entities spanning government, industry and other sectors of society, in situations ranging from ordinary times to full-on disasters.
